

ANNUAL HUMAN RIGHTS REPORT OF WHOLE BALOCHISTAN



The year 2022 has been a year marked by numerous human rights violations in Balochistan. The Counter-Terrorism Department (CTD) formed by the Pakistan Army and Frontier Corps (FC) have been responsible for the execution of hundreds of people under collective punishment in different areas of Balochistan and Sindh. The Baloch people have also been subjected to enforced disappearances, fake encounters, torture, and other forms of military brutality.


The impact of these violations has been devastating for the Baloch people, as they have been subjected to severe mental pressure and trauma. This has led to an increase in suicide incidents in Balochistan. Furthermore, a complete ban has been imposed on Baloch nationalist parties in the region, leaving only pro-military occupation groups with political freedom. This has created a

vacuum in Balochistan, leading to the suppression of the Baloch nation's awareness and ability to speak out for their rights.
Families of the victims of forced disappearance have been protesting for the recovery of their loved ones for many years. Despite the efforts of democratic

governments, negotiations between the government and the families have not resulted in any progress. Commission and committees established by the government have only further exacerbated the humanitarian crisis in Balochistan. Monthly reports on these abuses have been made public by the Paank Department of Human

Rights of the Baloch National Movement. Reports outlining the severe human rights violations carried out by state forces in Balochistan were published by The Paank. Aside from Amnesty International, Human Rights Watch, and Human Rights Working Group, the Department also reported Balochistan's human rights breaches to other international human rights groups. The Department of Human Rights will also present a yearly report on the events of 2022 to media outlets and human rights organizations in 2023. According to these reports, 195 cases of extrajudicial killings and 629 cases of enforced disappearances have been reported in Balochistan. It is clear that these violations are a clear violation of international law and human rights law, and it is imperative that action is taken to address and prevent these violations from continuing.






